- ❖ Leaders **infuse process and meaning into the lives of individuals** and into their organizational experiences.

EXPECTATIONS OF THE HEAD COACH

You are expected to provide the oversight of the entire sport program inclusive of ALL coaches, athletes, support staff, parents, booster club and the facility provided to you for practice and competitions.

This oversight includes:

- **Strategic Planning & Direction**: establishing & communicating standards and expectations
- **Supervision**: coaches, athletes, support staff, booster club, facility
- **Accountability**: overall compliance to policy and procedure
- **Assessment & Evaluation**

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE HEAD COACH

The HEAD COACH is responsible for...

...impacting student academic achievement in a positive way

...actively promoting and modeling sportsmanship and fair play

...communicating, with the assistance of their AD, expectations of behavior and conduct to parents

...the actions and conduct of ALL coaches, support staff and student-athletes

EVOLVING ROLE OF THE SCHOOL AD

FOCUS: Continued growth of responsibility and authority resulting in a more direct role in many areas.

“...to organize, plan and give direction relative to the expectations, responsibilities and efforts of those people directly supervising...”
